ABSTRACT SUBMISSION

ABSTRACT SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

The ASICON welcomes submission of abstracts for original contribution and to encourage work that introduces new ideas, concepts and research, deepens understanding in the field, and includes analyses of both successes and failures.

Please read the following Abstract Submission Guidelines carefully before submitting your abstract:

Abstract submission closes: 31st January 2026

Abstracts can be submitted only online via the Abstract platform on our website www.asi-asicon.com submissions by fax, post or email will not be considered. It is the author's responsibility to submit a correct abstract. Any errors in spelling, grammar or scientific fact in the abstract text will be reproduced as typed by the author.

Plagiarism:

The conference organizers regard plagiarism as serious professional misconduct. All abstracts are screened for plagiarism and, when identified, the abstract and any other abstracts submitted by the same author will be rejected. In addition, the submitting author's prole and scholarship application, if one has been submitted, will also be cancelled.

Ethical research declaration: The conference supports only research that has been conducted according to the protocol approved by the institutional or local committee on ethics in human investigation. The ASICON Scientific Committee may enquire further into ethical aspects when evaluating the abstracts.

Abstract submission process: Before submitting an abstract, authors must create a profile. More than one abstract can be submitted using the same Profile.

Abstract structure: Abstracts must be only in English. Abstracts in all tracks, and without exception, must be structured as follows:

- a. Background:** Indicate the purpose and objective of the research, the hypothesis that was tested or/and a description of the problem being finalized or evaluated.
- b. Methods:** Describe the study period, setting and location, study design, study population, data collection and methods of final analysis used.
- c. Results:** Present as clearly and in as much detail as possible the findings and/or outcomes of the study. Please summarize any specific results.
- d. Conclusions:** Explain the significance of your findings and/or outcomes of the study for HIV prevention, treatment, care and/or support, and future implications of the results.

Font: A standard font, for example, Arial, should be used when formatting the text. This helps prevent special characters from getting lost or corrupted when copying the text to the online abstract submission form. Ensure that you check the final abstract with the system's preview function before submission and edit or replace characters, as necessary.

Word limits: Titles are limited to 25 words. The abstract text body is limited to 350 words. The title or the body must NOT be in UPPERCASE.



ABSTRACT SUBMISSION

ABSTRACT SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

Recommendations:

- a. Abstracts should disclose primary Findings and avoid, whenever possible, promissory statements, such as "experiments are in progress" or "results/lessons learned will be discussed".
- b. Use of standard abbreviations is desirable. Place special/unusual abbreviation in brackets after full word the first time it appears.
- c. Do not include graphs and references in the abstract.

The Scientific Committee makes the final selection of abstracts to be included in the conference programme and any communication in regard to influencing an abstract review will not be entertained.

Abstracts can be selected for oral presentation in oral abstract sessions or to be presented as a poster. If you do not wish to make an oral presentation, please make the appropriate selection while submitting the abstract.

Rule of two: Each presenting author may submit a maximum of two abstracts at the conference. Should an author have more than two abstracts for submission, a co-author must be named as presenting author for one or more abstracts.

Notification of acceptance or rejection will be sent to the submitting (corresponding) author. Please note that only the corresponding author will receive an email concerning the abstract, this author is responsible for informing all co- authors of the status of the abstract. Authors whose abstracts have been accepted will receive instructions for the presentation of their abstract.

Scholarship application process: Abstract authors interested in applying for a scholarship must complete scholarship application by 31st Jan 2026, available through the online platform.

Only registered delegates are entitled to present the selected posters/papers.

17th ASICON: 6th - 7th March, 2026

With great pleasure we extend invitation for the 17th National Conference of AIDS Society of India-ASICON 2026 to be held at JW Marriott, Mumbai Sahar, Maharashtra, 6th - 7th March 2026. The ASICON will feature plenary, debates, symposia, workshops, case presentations, and meet-the-expert sessions with leading clinical experts and researchers as faculty in the field of HIV and other Infectious Diseases. There will be oral and poster sessions primarily targeted to budding doctors and scientists with an interest in the field. The conference will discuss and present the latest developments in diagnosis, prevention and management of HIV, co-infections/opportunistic infections and other emerging infectious diseases. Sessions on recent advances in the vaccine, early treatment, cure research, diagnostics and future drugs will be added strength.

The conference has a faculty with international and national experts. As a part of its continuous effort to enhance participation from young people, from its own resources, ASI has devised an ambitious Scholarship Programme for PG students, junior doctors and young researchers to enable them to attend ASICON and be part of the HIV and ID caring fraternity. Scholarship award will cover partial or full expenditure: registration, travel by train (A/C III tier) or bus and/or shared stay during conference days at the venue hotel itself and meals.

Priority will be given to applicants whose abstracts have been accepted for oral or poster presentation and for those nominated / selected by their Medical Colleges / Universities. Preference will be given to those with demonstrated interests in HIV care and research, their worthiness to clinical practice / research, region they represent, ASI life members and nominees of ASI Governing Council members.

Hence, applicants are encouraged to apply for ASI life-membership (www.asi-asicon.org). Those in recommending position (like dept. heads) will not be eligible for this scholarship.

Certificate of participation will be awarded only after two days of attendance in the conference. In email correspondence asi.asicon@gmail.com, please mention 'Scholarship' in the subject line.

ASI decision will be communicated: 10th February 2026 and will be uploaded on the website. Scholarship Committee's decision will be final.

Note:

1. Online Scholarship submission is open. If unable to do so, send a soft copy (by e-mail) to: asi.asicon@gmail.com before 31st January 2026.
2. Those submitting abstracts and/or applying for scholarship, it is advisable to book your tickets right away, to avoid inconvenience later.
3. Scholarships being limited in number, preference will be given to rest time applicants, Oral and Poster presenters. Only a few number of scholarships are available and hence they are reserved for medical graduates and science graduates.
4. Those applicants, who have received scholarships twice from ASI will not be considered.




CONFERENCE CITY - MUMBAI

Mumbai is spread across a narrow coastal strip along the Arabian Sea on India's west coast. Originally a cluster of seven islands, it has evolved into a continuous landmass through centuries of reclamation. The city is broadly divided into South Mumbai, the Western Suburbs, the Eastern Suburbs and the extended Mumbai Metropolitan Region. Its eastern side faces the Thane Creek, while the western edge opens to long stretches of coastline. 

Mumbai is well connected to major cities in India as well as the world.




By Air

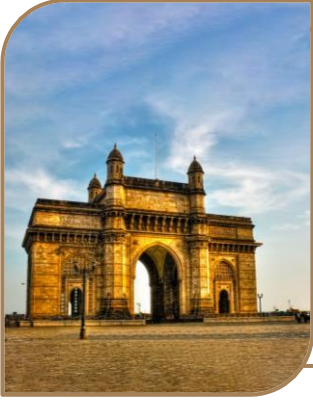


By Road

Rock-cut caves on Elephanta Island showcasing ancient sculptures, especially Shiva carvings, reached by a short ferry ride.



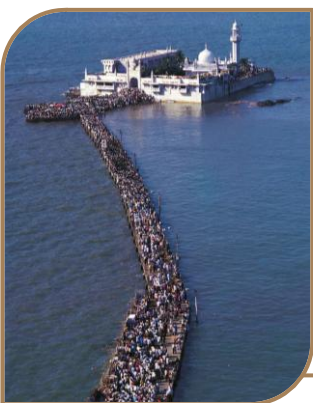
Bandra-Worli Sea Link

A vast urban forest ideal for nature walks, featuring ancient Buddhist Kanheri Caves carved into rocky hills.



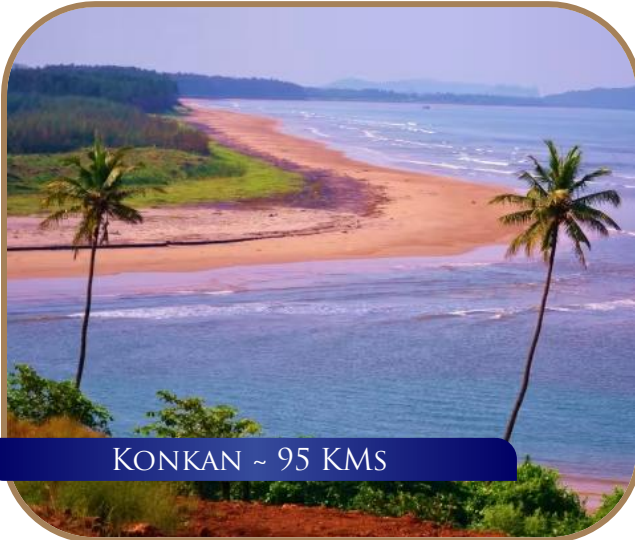

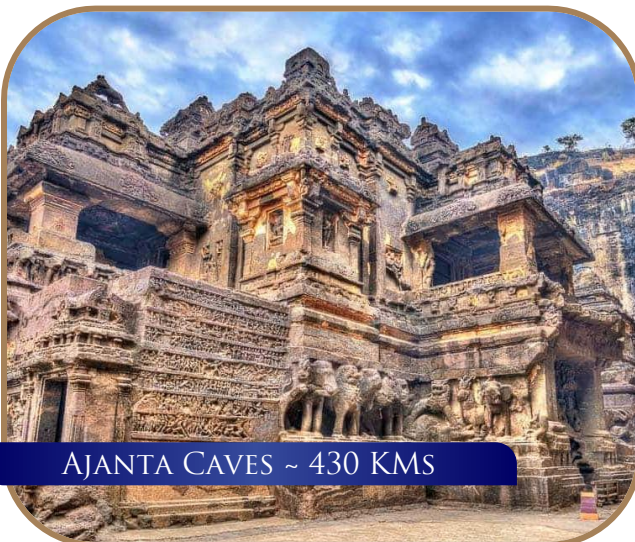

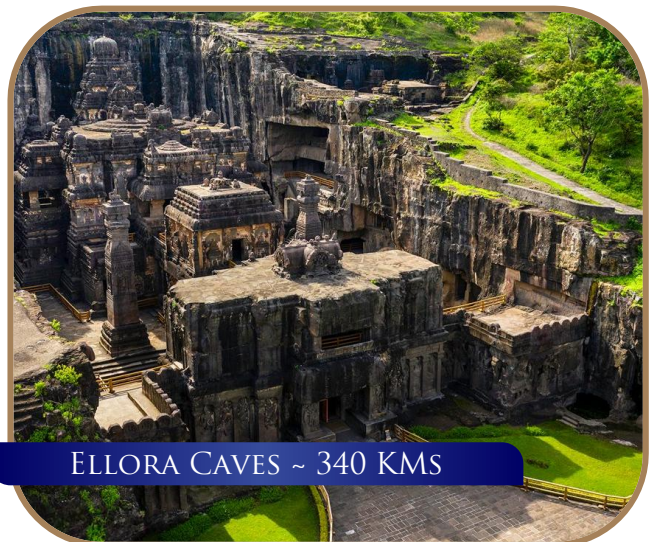
